AMC Members in Mission and Service Assignments

(from AMC's 25th Anniversary book, article written by Brian Petkau, on page 76)

"The Altona Mennonite Church has witnessed a small but continuous flow of its members into service assignments with Mennonite mission and relief organizations. In 1964 Gordon Braun started a two-year assignment with MCC in Basel, Switzerland. That same year Ken Braun left for Bethesda, Maryland, for a six-month MCC assignment at the National Institute of Health. Rose Penner served for two years, beginning in 1966, at Brooklane Psychiatric Centre in Maryland under MCC auspices. In 1970 Rose Penner again accepted a two-year service assignment, this time as a General Conference volunteer at the Markham Daycare Centre in Illinois. In 1972, Doug Funk and Bev Loewen assisted other Mennonite Disaster Service volunteers in the clean-up of flooddamaged Rapid City, South Dakota. In 1977 Eric and Kathy Fast began a three-year teaching assignment in Zambia under MCC. Ray and Marilyn Hamm, from 1979 until their return in 1985 to the Altona Mennonite Church where they assumed pastoral responsibilities, lived in Winnipeg, where Ray served as the Peace and Social Concerns director of MCC Canada.

1980 marked the year in which three families from the Altona Mennonite Church started service assignments: Eric and Laura Unger in Nigeria under MCC until 1983; Ken and Gwen Schlichting at Cape Croker Indian Reserve in Ontario until 1984, where Ken worked as farm administrator; and Ben and Pat Gerber Pauls at the Mennonite Seminary in Paraguay till 1984 under the General Conference. Ben and Pat Gerber Pauls returned to Paraguay in 1986 to begin a second term of teaching. In 1983 two families left the Altona Mennonite Church for service assignments with MCC: Eric and Kathy Fast to begin a three-year teaching assignment in Nigeria, and John and Norma Thiessen working until 1987 in East and West Berlin. Other members of the congregation have served for shorter periods of time in different service assignments, among them Dr. William and Selma Loewen in Paraguay and Belize. These individuals, by working in different parts of the world, gave the Altona Mennonite Church an opportunity to become more aware of the issues and concerns originating in those areas. This awareness, coupled with the service experience of many persons in the congregation, has given the Altona Mennonite Church over the years a strong service bias.

The early existence of the Altona Mennonite Church is characterized by the church's willingness to identify and respond to local needs in the community. This emphasis certainly reflected the interest of Frank H. Epp. Whether or not it originated with him does not matter. What is noteworthy is that the congregation was willing to respond to local and national issues."
